Did You Know? - Lake Mathews Reservoir

Have you ever noticed how the water level in Lake Mathews goes up and down? A homeowner was worried that the drought was causing the current low level, but it seemed like recently it had looked very high. After doing some research I found out a lot of interesting information about our neighboring lake.

Lake Mathews is the end reservoir for the Colorado River Aqueduct, carrying water through canals and pipelines from Lake Havasu. It is part of a complex system of reservoirs and distribution facilities operated by the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California (MWD), the nation's largest wholesale water agency.

MWD is a co-op of member supplier, Western Municipal Water.

The history of the reservoir construction is quite interesting. The property was originally owned by Lawrence Holmes, who in the 1920s planted 50,000 carob trees and irrigated them by creating dams and reservoirs. He lost his property to eminent domain in a lengthy court battle. Construction of Lake Mathews reservoir started in 1933, and water deliveries began in 1941.

The lake is surrounded by 4,000 acres of protected land, plus an additional 9,000 acres added to protect the Stephens kangaroo rat. The whole area is now called Lake Mathews Estelle Mountain Reserve. It is an important resource for birds such as ducks, grebes, golden eagles, and bald eagles. There is no public access to the lake, and attempts to allow recreation have been stymied by strong agreements between MWD and other entities. So although the water level may rise and fall, our lake is not disappearing any time soon!

What is the Board Working On?

Research continues on obtaining bids for an additional chain link equipment enclosure. An inquiry was made to get pricing on a locking dumpster for the arena. Three homeowners have requested extensions on the violation letters received. The trail walk violations follow-up is being scheduled. We will be working on the 2017 budget.
